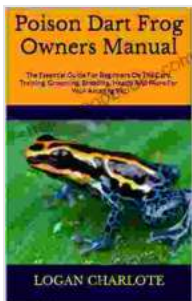

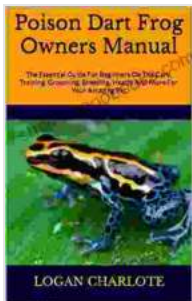
## **Health Care**
